### **SIMPLE PAST**

Used for actions that begin and end in the past.

♣ Adverbs of frequency: yesterday, last week, two days/weeks/months/years ago, in 1995.

Auxiliary Verb: DID

Verbs can be:

Regular (E)D is added to the infinitive

Examples: work[ed], stop[ped], live[d], study-studied

<u>Irregular</u> past form changes [See chart Irregular Verbs]

Examples: steal/stole see/saw write/wrote begin/began

#### AFFIRMATIVE FORM

I wrote a report yesterday morning

He worked in this office a few years ago.

They *lived* here when they were young.

### INTERROGATIVE FORM

A + S + V (infinitive)

**Did** you write a report?

**Did** he **work** in this office a few years ago?

**Did** they live here when they were young?

## NEGATIVE FORM

# S + A + NOT + V (infinitive)

You	did	not	write	a report.
Не	did	not	work	in this office a few years ago
They	did	not	live	here when they were young.

[Contraction for the negative form: didn't]
